



January to September 2023 Ministry Summary Report of Hong Kong Church Network for the Poor

HKCNP is a network platform that collaborates with partners to care for the poor, network together, and transform the community. Through a community-based transformation model of God's Kingdom, HKCNP utilizes the model of mentors and mentees, walking together to influence lives. With a focus on empowerment and nurturing the spirit and abilities, HKCNP walks alongside partners and churches, mobilizing community network resources to help churches serve the community, walking with the grassroots, and practicing the mission of God's Kingdom in the community!

Thank you for your continuous support for HKCNP. Below is the summary report of the ministry from January to September 2023, illustrating how these projects effectively respond to the needs of the church and the grassroots communities with the love of Christ.

1. Network Level

As a community network platform, HKCNP promotes the church's mission of community transformation, sharing knowledge and experiences with churches, providing suggestions and resources, and continuing to work alongside to explore, and practice community transformation from the view of God's Kingdom. HKCNP explores potential partners, establishes a core team, empowers churches to connect resources, and implements action plans.

The role of the HKCNP network platform and how it helps churches are as follows:

2. District Level

Therefore, in September 2023, we collaborated with the Department of Applied Social Sciences at the Hong Kong Polytechnic University to organize a 4-class "Blessing the Neighborhood" Home Visiting Volunteer Training Course. The course equips brothers and sisters who are interested in learning to visit and care for those in need within the community and become volunteers. The training program connects with 32 partner churches that are enthusiastic about serving the community. On average, each session has more than 120 participants. They are willing to take a step forward and practice their faith, to learn how to transform the community through a "Kingdom's Perspective"!</p> <p>HKCNP Squatter and Subdivided Housing Network "Youth Witnessing Community Needs Firsthand" on 29/8 & 30/8, Summer Fun Fun Fun Activities took place. HKCNP partnered with E-Concept leaders and partner churches to participate in serving subdivided homes for two days to help grassroots children in subdivided homes prepare for the new school year.</p>	<p>volunteer training program, to prepare for the upcoming community service in Tin Ping Estate, North District. At the same time, a "Blessing the Neighborhood" Home Visiting Volunteer Team will be led by partner churches of HKCNP, to care for the residents in the estate. After the course, HKCNP encourages participants to put into practice what they have learned in their respective communities through the "Practicing Community Service Activation Fund". Prior to this, HKCNP collaborated with "Household Electronics Reborn" (HER) and Tin Ping Estate Owners' Corporation to engage with the residents of Tin Ping Estate through partner churches, using second-hand home appliances as a preliminary service initiative. This aims to provide learning and activity resources for grassroots children living in subdivided homes who lack access to such resources, bringing joy to their lives. Additionally, the E-Concept high school students involved in the service also gained a better understanding of the needs of the children living in subdivided homes, broadening their perspectives.</p>

It has a population of approximately 30,000 residents (equivalent to around 10,000 households). Over 70% of the students come from grassroots backgrounds. The majority of the residents in the estate consist of housewives, while 11% of the estate population consists of the elderly, and 4,000 of the elderly residents live alone without any support from children. Shui Chuen O is located on a hill, where transportation is inconvenient for residents to travel to work, school, and other community facilities including after-school daycare, wet markets and shops, and elderly care services.</p> <p>Based on the Kingdom's community transformation model, HKCNP assists and supports the community through various service work in Shui Chuen O, exerting cooperative effort for the network to bring community transformation. Currently, each of the 18 blocks has a volunteer visitation team. In September, there were three Mid-Autumn Festival visitation activities for kindergarten students. The volunteer teams brought mooncakes arranged by HKCNP and "The Catering Evangelistic Fellowship", to care for the elderly in the estate.</p> <p>During this period, HKCNP has actively engaged in diverse community activities in Shui Chuen O, establishing connections with various organizations</p>

It consists of old tenement buildings, private residences, businesses, and fruit markets. Everyday, people from outside the district come to work and shop along with local residents. Amidst the bustling and busy urban life, there are still many grassroots individuals in the district who need support.</p> <p>In Yau Ma Tei, volunteers, churches, local organizations and volunteer groups are mobilized to network, collaborate in services and utilize various resources to serve the community. They make use of facilities within the district, such as the Yau Ma Tei Fruit Market, Guesthouse Owners, and Hotels to support grassroots individuals. It provides different service resources, methods and exchanges to support churches in serving the grassroots community and broadening their perspectives.</p> <p>HKCNP, along with Pastor Allen, Lai Kwong Chak, the Pastor Network Advisors and other partners, recognizes the needs of many grassroots individuals in Yau Ma Tei. Many churches are willing to lend their venues for storing and distributing essential supplies to meet these needs for future development. In addition to having the heart to serve, believers also need to enhance their skills and knowledge. Therefore, the "Community Ambassador Caring Experience Program & Advanced Training" has been organized. After four sessions, nearly 70 graduates from 47 churches have participated in this program. Their learning not only blesses the community but also brings their experiences back to their Churches and communities where they reside, empowering their lives. Furthermore, a group of pastors with like-minded passion and vision formed a network called "Neighborhood Support Fellowship". Regular meetings are held to share experiences in grassroots service. Some churches in this network engage with the community by organizing carnivals to connect with their neighbors. While others hold "Neighborhood Fellowship" to deepen relationships with neighbors, and provide support to their physical, emotional, and spiritual needs. They seek to understand the needs and provide appropriate assistance.</p>

3. Program Level

3.1. Love In Action

[Love in Action]By connecting with churches and providing food and various resources, frontline organizations and supporting partners can help and assist the grassroots population in the district. This allows the church to use these connections as a medium and starting point to help serve poor families through service, care and visitation for the long term in order to walk with them and transform lives.

HKCNP Agape Healthcare Eastern Pilot Scheme

"The Agape Healthcare Medical Pilot Program facilitates collaboration between clinics and churches, providing timely medical assistance to grassroots families who have difficulties accessing healthcare. Through sponsorships, these grassroots people receive free medical consultations, which benefits the individuals in need, providing opportunities for clinics to serve, and allows the church to walk with the grassroots people. This mutually benefits all three parties involved."- Dr. Siu Huen, HKCNP Workplace Fellowship Network Advisor.

The "Agape Healthcare Medical Program" was initiated by a partner church in the Kwai Tsing district in September 2022. It provides five free family outpatient services and basic medication to grassroots families in the district. Dr. Siu Huen, HKCNP Workplace Fellowship Network Advisor, believes that the "Agape Healthcare Medical Program" can continue to be developed in another district (such as North Point/Eastern District). The "Survey on the Effectiveness of HKCNP Love-in-Action" at the end of 2022, emphasized "Leverage Community Faith Networks - Share ideas for sustainable community-led development, fill in service gaps, develop pilot programs, respond to needs, build networks, and leverage synergies." HKCNP hopes to pilot this project in the community, to relieve the financial burden on grassroots families in their medical expenses and reduce their need for public healthcare consultations, alleviating the pressure of long waiting times. Through this program, HKCNP aims to respond to service gaps and develop and validate collaborative models that can effectively be replicated. This can bring together churches and doctors who want to join the program but may not know each other or have established a trust can provide holistic healing for the physical, mental, and spiritual well-being of individuals with local churches. Volunteers can continue to visit recipients, to empower both the beneficiaries and volunteers, create effective communication, build trust, and work together towards community transformation.

"I am extremely grateful to the church for providing my daughter with the doctor's vouchers, allowing her to see the doctor in time...she was able to receive effective treatment and catch up with her studies. I was moved to tears when I prayed, thanking the doctors and the Lord Jesus. I am so thankful for the visits from volunteering sisters, and their encouragement and support. I learned how to deal with problems calmly and release the burden in my heart. When my daughter's knee was injured, they helped me make an appointment with the doctor to resolve the problem. I am immensely grateful in my heart."

HKCNP collaborates with CDF partners to respond to the CDF comprehensive review by the Social Welfare Department

On July 7th 2023, the Social Welfare Department issued a press release stating that the Government Children's Development Fund Steering Committee recognized the need to comprehensively review the fund's operation to strengthen its uniqueness and advantages. The Social Welfare Department is responsible for conducting a comprehensive review of the key elements of the fund, with the preliminary completion expected by the end of this year. As a network platform and a strategic partner of the Children's Development Fund, HKCNP aims to promote and assist 60+ CDF partners in expressing their opinions to the Social Welfare Department on the comprehensive review of the CDF with the goal of retaining and optimising the CDF program. Based on HKCNP's collaborative experience with the CDF over the past years, feedback from partners, and results from opinion surveys, an initial draft of suggestions for the CDF review has been compiled. HKCNP has scheduled a prayer meeting to review the main elements of the Children's Development Fund (CDF) on August 10th, where participating partners prayed together for this review. HKCNP's CDF partners have provided valuable feedback on the opinion survey regarding the review of the key elements of the CDF.

Thanks to the leadership of Dr. Ricky Szeto, the Convener of HKCNP's Mentorship Projects, HKCNP arranged a seminar (where a total of 20 representatives from 16 operating and co-organizing units attended) on September 6th, to come together, share and exchange opinions with various partners. The Social Welfare Department has invited companies and stakeholders to participate in a focus group meeting to revise the key elements of the "Children Development Fund". The focus group meeting for CDF strategic partners was held on October 13th, with 5 HKCNP representatives. Let's pray for this meeting and the entire review process, and hope that the Social Welfare Department will consider the recommendations put forth by HKCNP.
