

Definition of KABCD

A process empowered by God, in which the people of a community grow in their ability to solve their own problems and manage their lives resulting in growth of the whole person (physical, psychological, spiritual) and improvement of the various aspects of their community. Through this process the individuals and the community become all that God intends them to be.

Steps to KABCD

“The Spirit of the Lord is on me, because he has anointed me to proclaim good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim freedom for the prisoners and recovery of sight for the blind, to set the oppressed free, to proclaim the year of the Lord’s favor.” (Luke 4:18-19)

Kingdom Asset Based Community Development (KABCD)

- A process empowered by God, every person is a precious capital in their community.
- The people of a community grow in their ability to face their own problems and manage their lives
- Resulting in growth of the whole person (physical, psychological, spiritual, social) and improvement of the various aspects (including health, education, career, relationship) of their community.

Connect with a group of disciples with a kingdom view (cross-church churches and organizations), unite in one mind...to establish and pass on a group of disciples with a kingdom view.

The role of the church in the community (Community resilience) refers to the continuous ability of the community to mobilize and use its comprehensive resources, gifts, and abilities to deal with, resist, and recover from adverse environments. The church in each community has the opportunity and call to become a media of community transformation.

1. Promote community cohesion – the church is called to love its neighbors and seek the well-being of the community
 2. Unity-the responsibility of the church is to explore and share the capabilities of the community and work together
 3. Advocate to churches, public, investment organizations and companies etc. in each community, hoping to mobilize them:
 - The required resources and capabilities will further enable each community to have greater flexibility and development
 - Remove any barriers or gain the basic services and increase resilience
 4. Be a blessing to others-the church is an important example and role model, call and inspire every community to achieve this goal
- * Transformation of a poor community by identifying the essential problem of that community and mobilizing the people as well as both inside and outside the community so that the community can solve those problems.
- * Seek the peace and prosperity of the city to which I have carried you into exile. Pray to the LORD for it, because if it prospers, you too will prosper. (Jeremiah 29:7)

- * The ability overcome adversity, 5 most common factors of resilient people
- They are resourceful and have good problem-solving skills
 - They are more likely to seek help
 - They hold the belief that they can do something that will help them to manage their feelings and to cope
 - They have social support available to them
 - They are connected with others such as family or friends. From the foundation of spirituality (recognizing and celebrating we are all inextricably connected to each other by a power greater than all of us, and that our connection to that power and to one another is grounded in love and compassion.
 - Practicing spirituality brings a sense of perspective, meaning, and purpose to our lives)
 - three other significant patterns emerged as being essential to resilience
- * Cultivate hope (the ability to set realistic goals - I know where I want to go, to figure out how to achieve those goals, and believe in ourselves - I can do this)
- * Practicing critical awareness
- * Letting go of numbing and taking the edge off vulnerability, discomfort, and pain. Practicing spirituality brings healing and creates resilience.
