Introduction

The government's Poverty Situation Report shows that the poverty population and poverty rate of children in 2016 were 229,000 and 23.0% respectively, in which almost 1/4 of children aged 18 or below were born in poor families. In spite of the drop of child poverty rate slightly from 25.4% to 23.0% since 2009, however, the child poverty rate of HK is ranked fourth among 35 OECD countries, following Turkey, Israel and Spain. It is ridiculous for Hong Kong as a "glorious" cosmopolitan city with a booming economy having so many children and young people suffering from poverty on behind.

For that, HKCNP Poverty Forum has chosen the theme of Poverty for Children and Adolescents, being different from the past. We invited pastors, NGO workers and believers that are ambitious in their youth ministries and are willing to help grassroots youth to get rid of poor. Hundreds of participants, with common beliefs and goals, come together to gather ideas and brainstorm. We are sure that we can produce useful and creative ideas. Don't let any idea lost, try your best to share it with your peers, and to build a plan helping the youth!

Workshops Introduction

The workshops are conducted in Cantonese & has simultaneous English interpretation; With Q&A section

"How to equip grassroots children from the starting line?"

Venue: G/F Lounge of Christian Center

Host: Island ECC

Target: Primary school children

Introduction: Due to lacking of financial support, children in grassroots families may have poor performance in study. Their parents feel helpless when seeing their children much behind in the starting line. The workshop will share valuable experience and problem-solving methods through the dialogue between the YWCA social workers and the Hope Foundation Director. We will explain how the churches can co-operate with grass-roots families to serve their children.

Middle School Youth: Companions for Tomorrow

Venue: 1/F Christian Centre Host: Sha Tin Baptist Church Target: Secondary school youth

Introduction: The workshop will introduce how the "Child Development Fund" (CDF) program can help the young people at the grassroots level and bring breakthrough opportunities. We will also share the current status and challenges of CDF operation, and other experience in serving the grassroots scheme. Above that, we have invited an experienced mentor who is also a current church mentor leader to share his testimony.

3 Sharing of life transforming Stories of Post-secondary Youth

5 Youth addiction: cool to get high?

Introduction: Addictive groups are becoming much younger and the proportion of adolescent addiction is getting much higher. There is also new addictive behavior: video games which attract young people to fall into the trap of indulging. Kei Yam Alliance Church and its service centers have served drug or gambling addicted people for many years. This workshop will share their experiences and counseling methods.
