Vision

Our Lord has heard the cry of the underprivileged people in Hong Kong, it's He who calls His people, sends them into communities of the poor: walk humbly with God, act justly and love mercy; speak according to the truth, act from a caring heart to manifest the witness of our church in trinity.

Mission

Founded by Hong Kong Chinese Christian Churches Union, Hong Kong Christian Council, Hong Kong Church Renewal Movement, frontline Christian agencies and churches which care for the poor, "Hong Kong Church Network for the Poor" (HKCNP) is a well-established network and community network platform which cares for the poor, delivers services and transforms the community collaboratively with partners. We are committed to identifying service gaps and developing multiple pilot schemes in response to the needs with our partner churches. With an emphasis on capacity building, empowerment and mentorship, HKCNP provides reliable services which combine knowledge and caring. We help and empower our frontline partners to expand services and be in contact with more deprived groups by consolidating community network resources, so the churches can deliver poverty caring work and achieve God's kingdom mission in the community more effectively.

"Hong Kong Church Network for the Poor" is a network and platform which connects our partners. As an institute which serves the underprivileged, instead of providing services directly, we render services through our partner churches, enterprises, schools and institutes.



Words from the Chairman

May you have a blessed and joyful new year filled with grace and peace. The fleeting passage of the year 2023 prompts us to reflect on the work accomplished by HKCNP throughout the year. Despite its demanding nature, the work has been profoundly meaningful, for which I sincerely express my gratitude to our Heavenly Father. In retrospect, HKCNP has remained steadfast in fulfilling the Great Commission entrusted to us by the Lord – to care for the poor, establish network partnership, transform community, and encourage the unit of churches.

The theme of last year's annual report was "One mind. One heart. One God." while this year's is "Poverty caring, network partnership and community transformation - Focus on Jesus, Journey with Love, and Recipients Become Benefactors." Thank the Lord for allowing the engagement of over 1,080 partnering entities with HKCNP last year. Notably, around 70 pastors were united through the platform of HKCNP during the HKCNP Pastor & Leader Retreat, where they blessed and supported one another, earnestly fulfilling the kingdom mission.

In collaboration with the Christian North District Chinese Association and Professor Wong Hung, Associate Professor (Teaching) from the Department of Social Work of the Chinese University of Hong Kong, we conducted a survey in North District last year. The findings revealed that the "Spiritual index" of the local residents consistently followed up by churches were higher than those of the general populace. This index encompassed indicators such as "inner peace" "spiritual fulfillment" and "the ability to bring happiness to others". The result reflected the positive impact of churches' work and the elevation of spiritual tranquility and happiness resulting from faith. As Jesus proclaimed, "In me you may have peace" (John 16:33), and "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give to you. Let not your hearts be troubled, neither let them be afraid." (John 14:27).

Last year, we achieved significant strides in community transformation in Shui Chuen O, North District, and Yau Tsim Mong District. Moreover, we fostered connections with numerous churches, including congregations, schools, and service organizations, through our network. For Love in

Action and mentorship, we continued implementing activities such as PeaceBox and the mentorship program of the Child Development Fund. Evidently, we have wholeheartedly dedicated ourselves to the development of our ministry, networking endeavors, and educational advocacy throughout the previous year (for further details, please refer to our annual report). Here I would like to express my sincere appreciation to my colleagues, as well as extend my heartfelt gratitude to the church leaders and individuals from various sectors who have placed their trust in us and provided us with steadfast support.

Having dedicated over two decades of my life to the service of HKCNP, I believe it is the time to pass on the torch. Human endeavors inevitably come to an end, yet God's work must perpetually advance. Gospel transformation of society

Luke records the mission of Jesus Christ during His earthly ministry: to proclaim good news to the poor, to proclaim liberty to the captives and recovering of sight to the blind, to set at liberty those who are oppressed. The Lord empowers all people, enabling the residents of a community to cultivate the capacity to resolve their own challenges and manage their own lives, thereby achieving holistic development in physical, mental, social and spiritual realms, and ameliorating various facets of the community (health, education, employment, relationships). Through this process, both the impoverished and the affluent can experience life transformation, living out God's intended purpose, and the community becomes a place that manifests the Kingdom of God.




Praying for society and establishing networked collaborative service relationships

That they may all be one, just as you, Father, are in me, and I in you, that they also may be in us, so that the world may believe that you have sent me. (John 17:21)

Kingdom Asset Based Community Development

HKCNP has consistently advocated that poverty encompasses four dimensions: economic, relational, spiritual, and motivational. "Kingdom Asset Based Community Development" (KABCD) is a theoretical framework grounded in the Triune God, the Kingdom, relationships, and networks. It relies on the empowerment bestowed by God to establish a process of coherent life transformation, bringing people's physical, mental, social and spiritual realms into the eternal peace of God's Kingdom.



"Kingdom Asset Based Community Development" comprises five stages. Tailored to the unique gifts and callings of its partners, HKCNP initiates community service, gradually journeying alongside them, deepening relationships with both partners and those being served, establishing these "social capital", and facilitating collaborative network resources to cultivate a sustainable community development model. HKCNP's diverse partner churches have discerned distinct visions for the communities they serve. Employing the "Kingdom perspective" as the foundation, HKCNP, through these five stages, promotes the unified deployment of each church's gifts and sharing of resources. HKCNP has been supporting the churches in exploring and developing contextually relevant community transformation models through pilot schemes of **Love in Action**, **mentorship programs** and **advocacy**. HKCNP has been working with multiple churches in promoting and implementing these beliefs. As of December 2023, HKCNP has engaged over 1,080 partnering entities in this transformative journey. We are deeply grateful for the trust of our partners and their willingness to share real-life testimonies, which encourage, educate, and accompany the community. In the following chapters, we will share real-life cases from five districts, showcasing how these theoretical frameworks have been manifested through the diligent efforts of our partnering entities, narrating the moving stories of life transformation and community witness.

As preparation, HKCNP has been disseminating the vision of sustainable community-led development to partners across Hong Kong Island, such as previously hosting HKCNP 101010 and "10.17 Fast-a-Meal" Caring for the Poor Movement with Evangelical Free Church of China Kong Fok Church, our partner church, and conducting a survey on the circumstances of underprivileged individuals in Central and Western District. Although Hong Kong Island exudes an aura of prosperity, affluence and advancement, the living conditions of many underprivileged residents in the area are no better than other districts, particularly in Western District where many sub-divided units exist. We are grateful that Kong Fok Church has collaborated with HKCNP to galvanize believers to engage with the community and explore sustainable models of community transformation in diverse districts. For instance, they have participated in the outreach services of HKCNP's partner churches and organizations across various districts such as Southern District, Tai Kok Tsui, Central and Western District, Tuen Mun, Sham Shui Po, Fanling and Yau Ma Tei. Over the years, the church has engaged in the Child Development Fund Mentorship Program (CDF) as mentors and HKCNP's community services, and also invited the Executive Director of HKCNP to deliver sermons at the church.

Advocacy, providing community service training, conducting prayer walks with partners, preaching at churches, conducting community situation surveys, etc. are some of the pioneering initiatives that HKCNP has undertaken with partners in various districts as preparatory work for community transformation. Considering the vision imparted by the Lord and the situation of the partner churches, appropriate resources are allocated to collaborate in community services. In 2023, Kong Fok Church connected with churches and organizations in Southern District to launch services, building upon the previous experience of walking alongside HKCNP partners. They continued to serve the community through a networked collaborative approach, bestowing blessings upon the community.

Explore resources plan: Kwai Tsing

Establishing a core team and pooling individual, congregational and community resources

The partner churches in the Kwai Ching District have consistently participated in various programs of HKCNP. We are grateful that Elim Church has shared their "Agape Healthcare Program" with HKCNP, enabling HKCNP and Workplace Fellowship Network Advisor Dr. Albert Siu Huen to reference it as they networked two partner churches in Kwai Chung to develop a program. This facilitates Christian doctors to explore models which integrate their professional expertise with service, so that the doctors' specialized skills and the churches can collaborate to walk alongside underprivileged families, providing holistic healing - physical, mental, social and spiritual - to those in need, transforming lives through Christ's love. We are appreciative that HKCNP has collaborated with the Christian Doctor Network, and medical students from the University of Hong Kong have participated in HKCNP's internship program, including engaging in the "Agape Healthcare Program"* to support frontline service in churches in Kwai Ching District. This has allowed them to experience and contemplate how to leverage their gifts to serve the marginalized groups in society.

In the course of implementing this program, we discovered that some underprivileged families were already connected with different churches in Kwai Ching District. Praise the Lord for using HKCNP's platform to cultivate inter-church relationships and trust, so churches are now willing to be transparent and communicative, sharing congregational resources to serve the local residents in need, synergizing to bless the community. We continue to pray for these network relationships, hoping that various pilot schemes can enable the churches in the district to develop diverse community transformation models in alignment with God's will, mobilizing more churches and believers with a heart to respond to community needs to unite in addressing service gaps in the district.

* Agape Healthcare Program 2023

- Alleviate the financial burden on underprivileged families for their routine medical expenses and mitigate the stress they face from prolonged waiting times at public healthcare facilities
- Through the collaborative efforts of clinics, churches and volunteers, achieve holistic healing addressing the physical, mental, social and spiritual dimensions
- Emphasize the significance of volunteers' deepened engagement and accompaniment
- Testimony: Nurse Tracy from the "Agape Family Health Clinic" shared, "I recall an instance when we visited a recipient with the volunteer team, and we prayed for the mother. She was deeply moved to tears, expressing that there is still love present in this world."

Mobilize the Shalom community: North District

Through the exploration of opportunities and the mobilization of community assets, HKCNP responds to gaps and creates community possibilities.

In November 2021, HKCNP collaborated with the Christian North District Chinese Association to host the "Transforming Lives in Community, Renovating Churches in North District Kingdom Assist Based Community Development Course (KABCD)" in North District. Adopting a "Kingdom Asset Based Community Development" service model, we aimed to bless this district, which the government would soon prioritize for development. Commencing with the course as preparatory groundwork, we uncovered the resources in the district through surveys and galvanized community participation in the investigation process. In the course of this endeavor, HKCNP established the Tin Ping Estate Network, utilizing Tin Ping Estate as a pilot site, to connect churches of diverse denominations and backgrounds in North District, as well as individuals passionate about serving the North District, facilitating the provision of cross-regional resources to transform lives and the community.

* YUM Church Youth Community Organizer Program

- Endeavoring to construct a novel community caring model through a mentorship-based approach
- Churches spearheading the recruitment and deployment of underprivileged youngsters aged 18-25 as community organizers
- Pastors nurturing and empowering youth through mentorship
- Testimony from a youth community organizer from Blessed Christian Church in 2023: "The most impressive part of service was accompanying my co-workers in providing care and support to a sister battling cancer. Despite her grave circumstances, her countenance radiated joy. This profoundly challenged my tendency to amplify present troubles, causing me to recoil and give up. Yet I witnessed the unassailable peace that God had bestowed upon her, reminding me to humbly submit to His leading."

Mobilize the Shalom community: North District

Thank the Lord for allowing HKCNP to participate and co-organize the "North District Church Christmas Carnival" hosted by The Hong Kong Chinese Christian Churches Union and the Christian North District Chinese Association in December 2023, and the "Mobilize Love Christmas Caroling" held at Tin Ping Estate with 19 churches, schools and organizations to collaborate and bless the residents of the North District. The pastors all shared their gratitude for blessing over 500 people that day, with 80 people willing to accept the Lord and attend church. We pray that the Lord will continue to watch over these new believers, allowing them to understand their faith through the church's care and guidance. In light of future development opportunities in the North District, HKCNP continues to network with various churches across Hong Kong, sharing resources with partners to address gaps in community services. We are grateful for the collaborative efforts over this period, serving and transforming the community together during Christmas, and witnessing this grace multiply. Moving forward, HKCNP will continue to bring community transformation into the North District, hoping to mobilize and connect with different churches to bear witness in unity and seize the Gospel opportunities in the development of the North District, showing the Kingdom of Heaven in the community and leading people to the Lord.

Empowerment and self-contained: Shui Chuen O

Fostering community resilience, transforming beneficiaries into helpers

By 2023, robust collaborative relationships had been established among various units of the HKCNP Shui Chuen O network. Beyond merely providing resources, HKCNP's pilot schemes have also advanced the development of a distinctive community service model capable of empowering lives. United in their efforts, the network members jointly propagate the Christian faith and put into practice the teachings of loving one's neighbor. In collaboration with the Netherlands School of Nursing of the Faculty of Medicine of the Chinese University of Hong Kong, HKCNP established the "Chuen Sum Cares for You" visiting volunteer team to attend to the needs of local elderly residents. Volunteer squads have also been set up across all 18 blocks of Shui Chuen O Estate, institutionalizing a clear service framework to assist the community in responding to unforeseen challenges. For instance, when a water heater explosion occurred at Shan Chuen House in 2022, fellows of HKCNP's partner churches were promptly informed by the Shui Chuen O Estate volunteers about the plight of the affected singleton elder. They then proactively stepped in to provide support and follow up on the elder's living condition and well-being, eventually forging long-term neighborly bonds, and the elder even underwent baptism and joined the church.

Some volunteer team members have participated in HKCNP's "District Social Caring Volunteer Coupon Subsidy Program"* , not only caring for neighbors within their own residential blocks, but also playing a vital role in facilitating collaboration across the entire HKCNP Shui Chuen O network. Gratefully, in 2023, the "Shui Chuen O Estate Christmas Carnival" saw the churches, organizations, schools and enterprises of the HKCNP Shui Chuen O network unite in cooperative efforts that benefited the community, collectively manifesting the joyous spirit of Christ's incarnation throughout the neighborhood. Many cross-regional groups have now gained insights into the needs of Shui Chuen O and the outcome of networked collaborative service through HKCNP, and expressed willingness to establish networks and channel additional resources to facilitate community transformation, in support of this frontline team serving the local residents.

- Churches invite trusted underprivileged individuals to serve as volunteers and participate in the church's community outreach programs.
- This not only provides churches with much-needed human resources to serve the community, but also allows the underprivileged volunteers flexibility in arranging their work schedules according to their needs. Throughout the service process, the volunteers' lives are supported and rebuilt in terms of economic, interpersonal, motivational and spiritual dimensions, which brings about life transformation.

Testimony shared by HKCNP district social caring volunteer Ah-Har: "I express gratitude to the Lord for His divine orchestration, as witnessing the diligent efforts of others has also steadfastly reinforced my heart to serve the community. I hope that we can imbue each household with the love and spirit of Christ, providing a formidable bulwark not merely in material terms, but more profoundly in the spiritual realm."

Empowerment and self-contained: Shui Chuen O



The HKCNP Shui Chuen O network collaboratively authored a "Resilient Stories" testimony compilation in 2022, chronicling the authentic stories of 25 Shui Chuen O residents, such as how partnering entities within the network rallied to support the neighbors amidst the pandemic. By 2023, brother Lau Man Leung of Shatin Baptist Church, a partner church in the network, had composed a song, with lyrics penned by brother Chu Ho Lim, dedicated to the Shui Chuen O residents. Here is an excerpt from the lyrics:

Song title: Precious Living Spring

Fear not the sloping path, for with perseverance you shall ascend to the summit
Allow laughter to accompany your journey, surpassing the torment of the years
If the burden grows too heavy, and loneliness takes root within your heart
Then let love replace your tears, transforming into healing waters

* Learn to cultivate gratitude, support and care for the elderly, spreading joy to those around you

This profound sense of neighborhood loyalty, manifested through the group of Christians, recognizes their role as integral community members, diligently ministering to the community and instilling this spirit of love and empowerment within their surrounding neighbors. Whether believers or not, akin to the lyrics, with a heart of thankfulness, they seek to assist those in need, transcending mere self-interest to actively contribute and embrace a shared cultural ethos, becoming a wellspring of blessing to others and fortifying the community's resilience.

Examples of five stages manifested in different districts of Hong Kong

Multiply network establishment: Yau Ma Tei

The community continues to undergo transformation, with all assets duly recognized and collectively developed in a manner that amplifies their strength and efficacy.

Pastor Lai Kwong Chak, HKCNP Pastor Network Advisor and convener of Praxis, has been walking alongside HKCNP, and the Yau Tsim Mong District network collaboration serving partners team has already cultivated a mature and distinctive service model tailored to the community's unique characteristics. For instance, they have forged relationships with proprietors in Yau Ma Tei Fruit Market, cooperating to serve underprivileged families and the homeless with fruits, and even distributing the fruits to HKCNP partner churches across 18 districts, as resources for frontline service and visit, enabling the churches to build enduring ties with the local populace.

Pastor Lai has also advocated the HKCNP "Kingdom Asset Based Community Development" model within the "Jordan Community Kingdom" Yau Tsim Mong District church network, encouraging more Christian collectives to contribute their gifts and resources, collaborating in a "networked collaboration" service paradigm, so that the service impact can be amplified through the network. By 2023, multiple churches within the "Jordan Community Kingdom" network have established "Neighborhood Fellowships" to accommodate the homeless and underprivileged individuals in the district, with many even undergoing baptism and joining the churches.

The "Community Ambassador Caring Experience Program - Advanced Training" has been convened for four iterations, with over 60 graduates from churches across the 18 districts bringing their acquired knowledge back to their communities and promoting the involvement of their own assemblies in community service, galvanizing more people to attend to the marginalized groups in the district.

Multiply network establishment: Yau Ma Tei

Through the auspices of HKCNP, multiple partnering entities in the Yau Tsim Mong District have coalesced to jointly host carnival events during the Christmas season in recent years. After years of cooperative experience, trust-building, and relationship cultivation, the partners have become increasingly amenable and confident in the networked collaboration service model. In 2023, the YMCA of Hong Kong in Yau Ma Tei, Island Worship Assembly and Praxis co-organized the "Yau Tsim Mong Christmas Carnival" to welcome and follow up with the participating local residents. HKCNP has also leveraged its network efficacy, inviting Hong Kong Disciplined Services Christian Fellowship, enterprises, and churches from other districts to participate. Various partnering entities have contributed in diverse ways, such as donating gifts, providing venues, and recruiting volunteers, once again attesting that the community harbors abundant resources. When everyone is willing to embrace the "Kingdom Asset Based Community Development", they can establish unique service modalities within their own

communities and transform the community together through Christ's love!



Review of major activities in 2023

HKCNP persists in promoting the "Kingdom Asset Based Community Development" model through diverse advocacy and educational initiatives, fostering unity among partners in "caring for the impoverished, fostering network partnership, and transforming the community".

Sharing session of "NT North District Survey" report by HKCNP and Christian North District Chinese Association

Through the "NT North District Survey", HKCNP and the Christian North District Chinese Association garnered a deeper understanding of the prevailing community dynamics in North District. The convened forum on 20 May 2023 provided a platform for the 80+ participating pastors, lay leaders, and dedicated servants from diverse congregations to collectively share their experiences and learnings from the practical outworking of community transformation efforts. One crucial finding in the report is that the "spiritual index" of the North District residents whom the churches have been consistently following up with are higher than those of the general populace. Guided by the survey findings, HKCNP has been diligently following up and mobilizing resources from partners across different regions who are eager to support and focus on the development of North District, "doing new things" in this locality. We have categorized the spiritual index into the following 3 facets:

1. "Experiencing inner peace" - Through the care and community service of the church, the recipients have encountered love, connection, care, and compassion.
2. "Feeling spiritually abundant" - Through the connections built with the church and the community, the recipients have expanded their social networks and enhanced their mental and psychological well-being, transcending the material deprivation and insufficiency.
3. "Able to bestow blessings" - Empowering the recipients, enabling them to transform from being the beneficiaries to becoming the benefactors, broadening their horizons, allowing their stories to become a source of blessing to others, and establishing a sense of achievement and improved self-image, passing on the feeling of happiness.



HKCNP co-organized the "Blessing the Neighborhood" Home Visiting Volunteer Training with the Department of Applied Social Sciences of the Hong Kong Polytechnic University

It is grateful that HKCNP and the churches in North District have established a strong foundation of networked collaborative service in their shared journey of "Kingdom Asset Based Community Development". Whether it is through prayer walks, volunteer training courses, or church leadership development programs, they have diligently shared experiences, human resources, and material resources. Furthermore, they have formed volunteer teams to regularly reach out and care for the underprivileged residents in the squatter areas in North District and Tin Ping Estate. In direct response to the insightful findings of the "NT North District Survey", they have equipped a cadre of volunteers who are eager to learn and provide compassionate care for individuals, families, and the elderly in need in the community, with a particular focus on addressing mental health and livelihood-related challenges. Upon completing the training, these volunteers can then register to serve as "Blessing the Neighborhood" home visiting volunteer in Tin Ping Estate in Sheung Shui, as well as apply for the "Practicing Community Service Activation Fund" established by HKCNP. This empowers them to put their newfound knowledge and skills into tangible practice within their local communities through congregations.

Review of major activities in 2023

JoyAge Volunteer Leaders Training Program

It represents an advanced iteration of the "Blessing the Neighborhood" Home Visiting Volunteer Training. HKCNP and the Department of Applied Social Sciences of the Hong Kong Polytechnic University have continued to co-organize this program, with 13 participating pastors and lay leaders from HKCNP's partner churches. They have gained profound understanding and mastered the holistic care techniques necessary to address the physical, mental, social and spiritual needs. Specialized programs like "Relaxing and Healthy Stretching" (stretching class) and "Thousand Steps to Health" (male walking group) have been carefully designed for the elderly in Tin Ping Estate to foster deeper relationships and build long-term support networks with the elderly in the district.



Publishing the book "Journey with the Poor to Transformation" and its English version

Featuring insightful biblical reflections and 22 real-life testimonies from HKCNP's partners, the book celebrates and reviews the fruitful outcomes of the "Kingdom Asset Based Community Development" model, presenting the beautiful witness of collaborative service. It also honors and appreciates the tireless efforts of the participating churches, working professionals, and dedicated individuals. The book aims to inspire readers to discover their own unique ways of serving the poor, so that they too can participate in and bear witness to God's miraculous work of transformation as individuals, in churches or in the community, enabling the poor to experience renewal in their physical, mental, social and spiritual dimensions, and together savor the peace and fulfillment that comes from the Lord.

HKCNP Church Space Transformation Ministry

The ministry empowers and supports partner churches to open up their spaces, deepen community relationships, and cultivate mutual trust among neighbors. By organizing space transformation workshops and pastoral fellowships, experienced churches are encouraged to share their knowledge and best practices of utilizing church spaces to serve the poor, thereby promoting a culture of generosity and sharing. In 2023, 3 workshops and 3 pastoral fellowships were held, connecting over 40 units on this collaborative journey.



Review of major activities in 2023

Agape Healthcare x HKCNP : Holistic Care Ambassador Training Course

HKCNP has dedicated itself to the holistic nurturing of volunteers - tending to their physical, mental, social, and spiritual well-being - in order to provide compassionate care to the underprivileged. This has facilitated the establishment of Healing Community, where volunteer teams engage in outreach services and mutually encourage one another as they experience God's work. The program ran from June 2022 to June 2023, garnering registrations from 228 brothers and sisters hailing from diverse local congregations. Upon the program's conclusion, the "Agape Healthcare Volunteer Team" was formed, comprising 28 members from different churches, to extend the blessings to various districts across Hong Kong. The 25 recorded sessions of the program have been uploaded to HKCNP's website, serving as online training resources for churches or believers aspiring to reach out and serve their communities.



Community Ambassador Caring Experience Program-Advanced Training Alumni

The "Community Ambassador Caring Experience Program - Advanced Training" was completed for the 4th time in 2023, with 45 graduates from different churches joining the alumni association. They convene to share how they have applied the learnings to their own congregations from time to time, and have formed reading groups utilizing the "Journey with the Poor to Transformation" group discussion material to facilitate discussions and prayers.



10.10.10 Caring for the Poor Movement

In observance of the United Nations' "International Day for the Eradication of Poverty" for the 11th consecutive year, HKCNP organized 3 online sharing sessions for the "10.17 Fast-a-Meal" Caring for the Poor Movement, attracting over 90 participants who gathered to witness and contemplate how to become a blessing to the community.

HKCNP Pastor & Network Leader Retreat 2023

Over 70 pastor leaders serving on the frontlines of community work were invited to the "HKCNP Pastor & Network Leader Retreat" on 28 November 2023. Under the facilitation of and with the sharing by Dr. Pan Yi Jung of the China Graduate School of Theology, the participants convened in regionally-oriented small groups to share their distinctive visions and aspirations for their respective neighborhoods, discerning unmet service needs, and exploring innovative modes of inter-congregational collaboration. Through this retreat experience, the attending pastors were spiritually rejuvenated and galvanized, empowered to continue their steadfast efforts to exemplify the attributes of God's Kingdom within the local communities where their churches are embedded, thereby instilling a sense of hope.



Review of major activities in 2023

HKCNP Dr Mac Pier Sharing Session

HKCNP is honored to invite Dr. Mac Pier, one of the key founders of Global Movement Day (a city-wide transformation day) with extensive experience in the world, to hold a sharing and exchange session on December 7th 2023. Over 60 pastors have signed up to participate. Dr. Mac shared five principles for fruitfulness in urban ministry, with Hong Kong being significant. Currently, over 100 countries and 450 cities use this principle to respond to community needs and empower Christian leaders to bring God's Kingdom culture into the community. Finally, Rev Lin Chun-Choi, HKCNP District Network Convenor, shared his testimony of how he transformed lives and communities in Shui Chuen O through collaboration.



Future Leader Internship Program 2023

In 2023, HKCNP hosted 12 local and international students from the Chinese University of Hong Kong, as well as 6 medical students arranged by the HKU Healthcare Backpacker. The interns participated in the frontline service work of partner churches, gaining first hand understanding of community poverty while also contributing human resources to the congregations. Beyond frontline work, they were also involved in planning and refining HKCNP's ministries, promoting a networked collaborative community care model.



Articles by HKCNP

In 2023, HKCNP published over 20 articles on Christian Times, Christian Weekly, Herald Monthly, Mingpao and Five Loaves & Two Fish Newsletter of Hong Kong Christian Council to share the philosophy of poverty caring, encourage readers to reach out to the crowd and serve the community.

Worships and sermons

In 2023, HKCNP visited over 10 partner churches or denominational alliances for sermons to share information about poverty caring, and expressing concern for the churches, walking alongside them.


