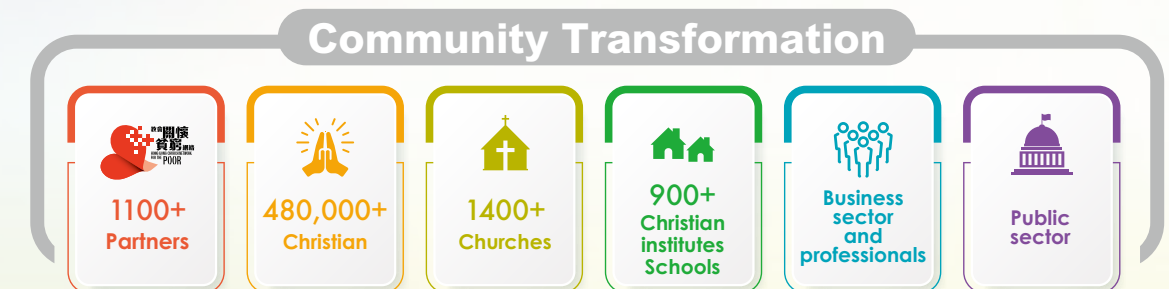

We help and empower our frontline partners to expand services and be in contact with more deprived groups by consolidating community network resources, so the churches can deliver poverty caring work and achieve God's kingdom mission in the community more effectively.

## Words from the Chairman

Thank God for having established HKCNP with the support of three founding organizations since 1997: the Hong Kong Chinese Christian Churches Union, the Hong Kong Christian Council, and the Hong Kong Church Renewal Movement. Under the guidance of Rev. Li Ping Kwong, Dr. Philemon Choi Yuen Wan, and our board of directors, we have diligently expanded this poverty alleviation network, which now encompasses over 1110 partnering entities. This collaboration enables us to forge meaningful connections with our partners, work hand in hand to care for the underprivileged, build networks, and transform communities. A few years ago, Dr. Choi stepped back from the frontline to prioritize his well-being, and in 2024, Rev. Li Ping Kwong also resigned from the chair position for similar reasons, entrusting the role to me. I wish to express my profound respect and gratitude for the invaluable contributions of these two pioneers in establishing HKCNP and for introducing me to this ministry.

Establishing a poverty alleviation network to transform communities is a sacred mandate. To this end, we are dedicated to consolidating community resources, assisting and empowering our frontline partners, enabling them to expand their services, reaching a greater number of those in need, and more effectively realizing the God's Kingdom mission within the community.

Simultaneously, we aspire to foster sharing and mutual blessings among churches, providing support for one another and cultivating collective growth. Consequently, since 2022, we have organized an annual Pastor & Leader Retreat. During the HKCNP Pastor Network and District Network Pastor Retreat on 4 December 2024, Dr. Pan Yi Jung, Lam Ko Kit Tak Associate Professor (Practical Studies) of the China Graduate School of Theology, reminded us that we are in a "new season"—a pivotal opportunity for the Lord to expand His Kingdom in Hong Kong. She encouraged us to listen to the guidance of the Holy Spirit, to be attuned to the shifts in our external environment, and to actively engage in experiential learning and practice. Through this process, we can foster team sharing and dialogue, and jointly explore new pathways in the community.

To this end, we have planned to provide pastors with more opportunities to gather, engage in fellowships, share their visions, encourage one another, and seek the Lord's purpose for the community in quiet retreats. We pray that such a network will help us renew our hearts to the abundance of the Kingdom, fostering cooperation, interdependence, sharing, and transformation, while nurturing profound relationships grounded in mutual trust. The year 2024 was, on one hand, a year of abundant harvest: we witnessed the establishment of more regional networks, increased collaboration among partners, heightened enthusiasm from churches actively serving the community, and a growing number of pastors with a Kingdom vision participating in our community transformation movement.

On the other hand, it had also been a year fraught with challenges, as the growth of our poverty alleviation ministry increasingly highlights the severe economic difficulties and pervasive poverty within society. As we look toward 2025, we anticipate even greater challenges ahead. In a recent board meeting, we resolved that, in light of the increasingly dire economic conditions, we must walk closely alongside those in poverty—we will endeavor to allocate more resources and focus these resources on our poverty alleviation ministry. We eagerly look forward to continuing our mission of "caring for the poor, networking partnership and community transformation" as we serve those in need alongside our partner churches. We are grateful to learn that one of our founding organizations, the Hong Kong Chinese Christian Churches Union, has adopted "Christ Among Us" as one of their visions this year, which resonates with our commitment to establishing the Kingdom here on earth. We pray that the Holy Spirit will guide us to embark on new pathways together, achieve victory through the Lord and bring the beauty of the Kingdom to this city beloved by our Lord Jesus. May His will be fulfilled, and glory be unto Him!

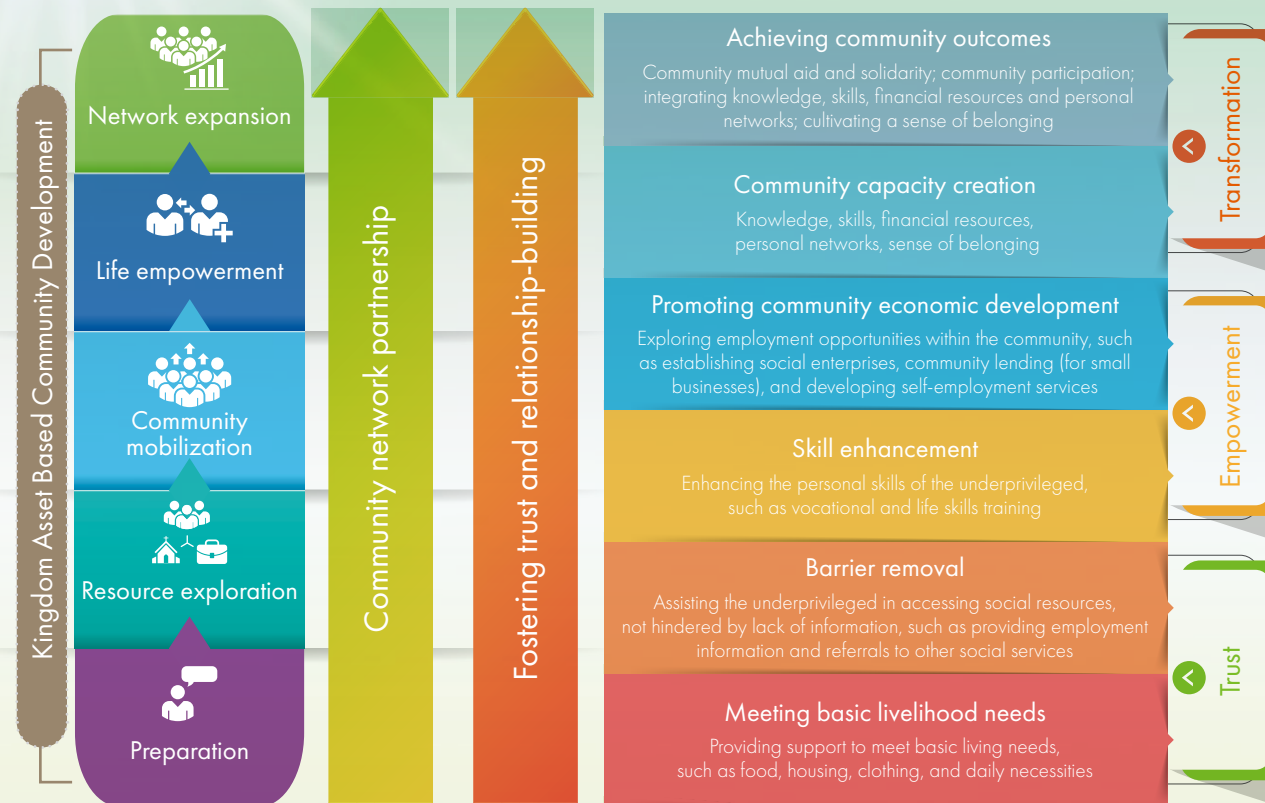

## Gospel transformation of society

## Kingdom Asset Based Community Development

As we engage deeper with the poor, we gain a more profound understanding on their holistic whole-person needs. We recognize that poverty encompasses four dimensions: financial, relational, spiritual and motivational.



“Kingdom Asset Based Community Development”

HKCNP has developed this sustainable model to respond to the comprehensive needs of grassroots individuals, empowering the community and fostering care and collaboration within the Christian community. "Kingdom Asset Based Community Development" (KABCD) is a theoretical framework grounded in the Triune God, the Kingdom, relationships, and networks. It relies on the empowerment bestowed by God to establish a process of holistic life transformation, bringing people's physical, psychological, social and spiritual realms into the eternal peace of God's Kingdom.

"Kingdom Asset Based Community Development" comprises five stages. Tailored to the unique gifts and callings of its partners, HKCNP initiates community service, gradually journeying alongside them, deepening relationships with both partners and those being served, establishing these "social capital", and facilitating collaborative network resources to cultivate a sustainable community development model.

HKCNP's partner churches have discerned distinct visions for the communities they serve. Employing the "Kingdom perspective" as the foundation, HKCNP, through these five stages, promotes the unified deployment of each church's gifts and sharing of resources. Our aspiration is to cultivate a community imbued with respect, empathy, compassion, creativity, innovation, commitment, enthusiasm, trust, joy, vitality, happiness, contribution, and opportunity. Let us follow our King Jesus and fully realize the potential and greatness within each of us for His Kingdom. Through our calls to action or subsequent activities, we aim to provide opportunities for individuals to unleash their potential and partake in the abundance of God.

## Gospel transformation testimony

HKCNP supports partners across all eighteen districts in Hong Kong to serve and transform grassroots individuals and communities. Through prayer, we seek Father's guidance, strategically concentrating on several districts in 2024.

### District version: Northern Metropolis

In the 2021 Policy Address, the government emphasized the development of the "Northern Metropolis", which spans 300 square kilometers. Once fully realized, the Northern Metropolis is projected to accommodate 2.5 million residents, approximately one-third of Hong Kong's current population. Following prayerful consideration, we are responding to the opportunities presented by the development of the Northern Metropolis. Since 2021, HKCNP has initiated the "Transforming lives in Community, Renovating Churches in North District, Kingdom Assist Based Community Development Course" (KABCD Course) in the North District. We invited Rev. Lee Hoi Ping, then-chairman of the Christian North District Chinese Association (CNDCA), to serve as the convenor of HKCNP North District Network, collaborating with CNDCA and over 60 congregations in the North District to address future development needs. Below are the milestones achieved by HKCNP and the Northern Metropolis Kingdom Network team since 2021:

#### 2021

17 congregations in the North District participated in the "KABCD Course", with Rev. Lee Hoi Ping, chairman of CNDCA, serving as the convenor of HKCNP North District Network, who continued to share the vision for the development of Northern Metropolis with various congregations in the North District.

#### 2022-23

HKCNP conducted a community survey in the North District, identifying the following service gaps:

1. The impoverished living conditions of residents in public housing estates, privately owned homes, and squatter settlements.
2. Underprivileged groups who do not benefit from social welfare support.
3. Mobilizing residents at the Golden-Age in the community to serve as human resources to address community needs.

#### 2023

In response to these identified service gaps, HKCNP launched the following pilot schemes in collaboration with 19 partner congregations in the North District:

1. Establishment of HKCNP Tin Ping Estate and Squatter Area Network.
2. Connecting congregations through HKCNP's Love in Action projects to address service gaps.
3. Forming the "Blessing the Neighborhood" volunteer team, trained by a team from the Hong Kong Polytechnic University, equipping over 50 seniors to serve as volunteers, utilizing Tin Ping Estate as a pilot site for service.



## Gospel transformation testimony

### Actions in 2024

1. In 2024, there were over 60 congregations in the North District. HKCNP sought to collaborate with various congregations in the district to address community needs through diverse services and gatherings, aspiring to bless the North District through network synergy.
2. In response to the challenges faced by residents in public housing estates, HKCNP established the Blessing the Neighborhood volunteer team in Tin Ping Estate and Squatter Area Network, equipping over 50 elderly believers as volunteers to bless residents through periodic services and regular visits, enabling the church to walk alongside them. (Please refer to Review of major events in 2024 on pages 17-19 for details)
3. To address the needs of squatter residents, HKCNP aided the Sheung Shui Baptist Church in deepening its relationship with Tin Kwong Po Village, allowing other stakeholders in the society to recognize the needs of squatter communities, collaborating with local churches to provide training and resources, connecting cross-district manpower and material support for service.
4. In seizing new development opportunities in the North District, HKCNP leveraged its Social Caring Volunteer Coupon Subsidy Program and Church Youth Community Organizer Program (both of which were detailed in the "Gospel transformation testimony - individual version"), empowering grassroots individuals to receive assistance and enhancement in various aspects—physical, psychological, social, and spiritual—while improving their communication skills, initiative, community awareness, sense of belonging, and overall well-being.
5. HKCNP encouraged churches to transcend traditional frameworks and respond innovatively to future development needs of the North District (e.g. through space transformation).
6. Promotional videos were produced to elevate public awareness of development opportunities in the North District.
7. HKCNP regularly organized community exploration activities in the North District, enabling more partnering entities to understand the future gospel needs in the area. It encouraged greater participation from various associations in community transformation of the North District, urging different denominations to establish churches, service points and educational institutions in response to the development and gospel opportunities in the Northern Metropolis.

We are grateful to witness God continually empowering and moving more entities collaborating, engaging and serving on the frontlines with the Kingdom perspective. In the process, they keep learning the community needs and sharing resources which hearts and minds are being renewed. The experiences and testimonies accumulated over the past three years became a source of encouragement and motivation for collaboration during network meetings held by HKCNP and CNDCA.

## Gospel transformation testimony

### District version: Shui Chuen O

Shui Chuen O Estate, completed in 2014, is a new public housing estate located in a more remote area of Shatin. HKCNP, together with pastors and church leaders who care for the estate, visited the estate to gain firsthand insight into the needs and circumstances of the 30,000 grassroots residents. They engaged in prayer walks and shared the vision for community transformation. Thanks to God's guidance and sustained efforts of HKCNP Shui Chuen O Network over the years, Shui Chuen O Estate has become a "loving community" infused with Christ's compassion.

From the outset of the estate's construction, we have sought divine direction through prayers to serve these neighbors. In 2019, HKCNP collaborated with 4 core congregations and multiple partnering entities, collectively embracing a clear vision to serve Shui Chuen O through a model of network collaboration and Kingdom Asset Based Community Development. To better understand community needs and enhance local service, a survey was conducted in March 2019 with residents of Shui Chuen O, revealing significant service gaps for elderly individuals living alone or in elderly couples.

Since 2020, the Shui Chuen O Network partner team has collaborated with the Nethersole School of Nursing of the Chinese University of Hong Kong to establish the "Chuen Sum Cares for You" visiting volunteer team, empowering local women to become benefactors. These women were assigned to visit elderly residents living alone, providing long-term follow-up and care. Through volunteer training, they acquired nursing knowledge and skills for visiting elderly residents, cultivating a group of dedicated volunteers with strong relationships. This initiative transformed Shui Chuen O Estate into a community characterized by love and a culture of mutual support.

In 2023, the HKCNP Shui Chuen O Network successfully established visiting teams composed of core workers and volunteers for each of the 18 buildings in Shui Chuen O Estate. Initially starting with 4 congregations in Shatin, the network expanded to include 15 partnering entities, witnessing Shui Chuen O transform into a community grounded in Christ's love and the Kingdom perspective. The team continued to explore and expand various networks while sharing community resources, collaboratively serving the residents alongside local volunteers.

In January 2023, a fire erupted in Shan Chuen House in Shui Chuen O Estate. Upon learning that a singleton elder, Mr. Siu, had experienced a water heater explosion, partner church workers swiftly reached out to visit him. They discovered he was facing financial difficulties, and the workers accompanied him in prayer, following up on his needs and providing necessary supplies. This brought Mr. Siu comfort from Christ and a profound sense of care. We are grateful that in 2024, Mr. Siu was baptized and joined one of the partner churches.

In November 2024, a local volunteer from Shui Chuen House suffered a fire at home, causing extensive damage. Upon hearing the news, the HKCNP Shui Chuen O Network partner churches immediately provided clothing and grocery vouchers

to support the family. The following day, along with Ah Ha, a HKCNP community ambassador, church sisters and several "Chuen Sum Cares for You" volunteers, went to the homeowner's residence to assist with cleaning and organizing. They provided emergency funds and prayed for the family's physical and spiritual well-being during a Zoom prayer meeting. The homeowners expressed heartfelt gratitude, stating they felt as though 100 people were supporting their family. It was truly moving!

These actions exemplify the network team's unwavering commitment to embodying the spirit of neighborly vigilance and support, reaching out to those in need, and providing appropriate assistance. We are pleased to witness Shui Chuen O evolving into a community rich in happiness and warmth, reflecting the culture of the Kingdom, and we eagerly anticipate how the Lord will continue to transform this community.

In 2024, we welcomed an even greater diversity of resources and companions, and we are thankful that many individuals from various districts were drawn to this "culture of care". Through connections with HKCNP, they specifically came to serve in this remote community. We are grateful for our partners who mobilized the elderly, kindergarten students and women to unite in mutual support. During various festive occasions, we saw children visiting elderly residents in Shui Chuen O Estate to offer blessings, as well as retirees utilizing their knowledge and skills to serve. Local businesses also allowed HKCNP to display event posters, encouraging neighbors to participate and support these initiatives. These trusting relationships have been cultivated through the ongoing collaboration within the Shui Chuen O Network, fostering a sense of community belonging.

This year, the team continued to organize the "Shui Chuen O Estate Christmas Carnival" in the estate, collaborating with network partners from churches, social services, and educational institutions to disseminate the joy of Christ's birth. Over 60 volunteers came together to bless more than 800 residents, witnessing the remarkable transformation of Shui Chuen O.

In 2025, we look forward to continuing to deepen volunteer relationships, amplifying the culture of care, and establishing a legacy of shared vision among neighborhood leaders while exploring innovative approaches to new initiatives. HKCNP will also persist in promoting partner churches in cultivating volunteer leaders with a Kingdom perspective and connecting resources from schools, enterprises and organizations. May the Lord bless more families in the area, and may the HKCNP Shui Chuen O Network continue to renew and transform in Him!

## Gospel transformation testimony

### District version: Yau Ma Tei and other districts

#### Yau Tsim Mong District

In 2022, the Urban Renewal Authority published a study on the Yau Ma Tei and Mong Kok areas, revealing that reconstruction plans were underway in Yau Ma Tei, Mong Kok and Tai Kok Tsui. It is anticipated that the community will experience significant changes over the next decade. Consequently, HKCNP invited pastors from congregations in these areas, who have long been committed to serving the community and understanding its needs and challenges, to share their insights and visions from the Lord. They were encouraged to seize the opportunities presented by community reconstruction, continuing their collaborative efforts to care for grassroots individuals in the community and facilitate transformation in the lives of both believers and the broader community.

Pastor Lai Kwong Chak, HKCNP Pastor Network Advisor, led the "Jordan Community Kingdom" initiative in the Yau Ma Tei area, fostering collaboration among churches, organizations, schools and enterprises in the Yau Tsim Mong District to transform the lives of residents and the community. The team diligently built relationships with small business owners in Yau Ma Tei, sharing God's Kingdom value of community care. Regularly, they distributed fruits donated by local fruit shops in Yau Ma Tei Fruit Market through the platform of HKCNP, extending this mutual aid concept to partners across all 18 districts in Hong Kong to better serve the community.



In 2024, a level 3 fire broke out at New Lucky House in Jordan, resulting in multiple casualties. In this crisis, the network swiftly responded to provide support, including temporary accommodation for affected residents. The "A Cup of Cold Water" HKCNP Emergency Relief Fund and the Y Carecation Vacation Accommodation Scheme, both under HKCNP's Love in Action scheme, were made available to pastors for immediate assistance to those impacted. Partners, united by God's Kingdom values, demonstrated profound care for one another, enabling us to witness love and support among local and even cross-district partners.

We are grateful that by the end of 2024, 5 congregations in Yau Ma Tei and Jordan established a core group engaging in mission group activities to share, pray, reflect on their service, and continue walking together. This initiative promoted the community's embodiment of the "Kingdom perspective", church unity, and mutual care as members of one body. Regularly held "Pastor Leaders Breakfast Fellowship" enhanced partnerships with various congregations, and the "HKCNP Yau Tsim Mong District Pastor Network" was established to provide ongoing support for pastors in responding to community needs.



#### Other Districts

In 2024, HKCNP collaborated with Oneness Conference to collectively emphasize the importance of walking together within the network. HKCNP took on the role of facilitating group discussions and matchmaking during the events. Over the years, HKCNP has engaged in Kingdom Asset Based Community Development alongside various partners across all 18 districts of Hong Kong through initiatives such as Love in Action, mentorship programs and educational advocacy. A longstanding relationship of trust and collaboration has been established with partners, allowing for a deep understanding of the needs, visions and gifts of partner churches. Through connection and matchmaking, we aspire to generate more innovative ideas and shared insights.

In 2025, we anticipate that more partners will continue to embrace the Kingdom Asset Based Community Development, collaboratively devising new methods to transform communities and jointly undertaking the mission of disseminating Kingdom values within the community!

## Gospel transformation testimony

### Individual version: YUM Church Youth Community Organizer Program (YCO)

HKCNP has consistently prioritized the development of youngsters, promoting a mentorship model that encourages the Christian community to engage in mentorship programs. This approach influences lives through personal experiences, nurturing the transformation of youth.

In early 2021, HKCNP launched the inaugural "YUM Church Youth Community Organizer Program", extending the mentorship model to partner churches. This initiative aims to establish a new social engagement framework by inviting partner churches that support Kingdom Asset Based Community Development to take part. The program provides funding for churches to recruit grassroots youth as community organizers, thereby augmenting the churches' manpower and fostering active participation in community service to address the needs of grassroots citizens. Through various community service initiatives, the program seeks to establish long-term relationships with beneficiaries, allowing them to experience God's love and learn about the Gospel. Furthermore, pastors offer direct support



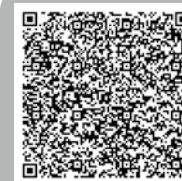
to the youth by providing work experience in community service alongside skills training and spiritual development. Utilizing the mentorship model, pastors nurture the growth of youngsters, assisting community organizers in developing a positive work ethic, cultivating good habits, mastering interpersonal skills, and recognizing their strengths and potential. This equips them with essential soft skills for future careers. Regular follow-ups and community service experiences with pastors help broaden the youth's perspectives,

enhance self-awareness, improve skills, nurture their spirits, and plan their careers, thereby strengthening their relationships with pastors. After the program concludes, participants continue to connect with the church for ongoing pastoral care.

In 2025, we plan to expand the program, hoping to amplify its impact and enable more partner churches committed to serving the community and fostering the growth of grassroots youth to walk alongside with God and transform lives.

We are grateful to God for the positive outcomes observed among all participating partner churches in the program in 2024. Below is a sharing from Hong Kong Yan Kwong Bethel Church, a partner church of HKCNP (please scan the QR code to view the related video):

"I am grateful to Miss Lee for meeting with me weekly and expressing genuine concern for my work situation, academic direction and spiritual growth. She has helped me identify some distorted beliefs regarding education and advancement in my personal development, encouraging and affirming my pursuit of my goals and interests, while instilling confidence in my abilities and worth in the eyes of the Father. I also appreciate HKCNP for introducing my career planning mentor Agnes, who inspired me to recognize and cultivate my strengths, clarifying my career interests and direction. # Gospel transformation testimony

## Individual version: Social Caring Volunteer Coupon Subsidy Program

In response to the social gaps arising from post-pandemic employment conditions, HKCNP has launched the "Social Caring Volunteer Coupon Subsidy Program", inviting eligible churches in need to participate. This initiative aims to support frontline community service of the churches, empower volunteers to transit from beneficiaries to benefactors, and deepen the relationship between partner churches and volunteers for long-term care and companionship. Additionally, it fosters a sense of belonging among volunteers as they experience Kingdom values and give back to the community with blessings.

HKCNP provides resources through supermarket gift vouchers to subsidize volunteers in their frontline community services at partner churches, while also addressing their basic living needs and enhancing their personal skills, including vocational and life skills training. One of the participating partner churches, the Faith Love Lutheran Church, effectively utilized this resource in conjunction with its "Creative Dream Workshop" ministry, which allowed several grassroots women involved in the program to experience personal transformation and embrace God's Kingdom values.

Partner churches invited mentors to teach these women various craft skills, such as beadwork and silversmithing. Pastors and mentors established supportive relationships with the participants, embodying Christ's love. The women's creations were sold at markets or used for community service. We are grateful that throughout this program, the grassroots women have built supportive and collaborative relationships with one another, growing together within the church. Below are reflections from the pastors and participating women:



"We participated in this program to provide resources to assist a group of community women who are unable to work outside the home due to caregiving responsibilities. Throughout the training process, the relationships formed between the women and the church mentors felt akin to family ties. They were profoundly grateful to the church, and we have invited them to join gatherings to learn about the Gospel. They have now started attending worship services, and we eagerly anticipate their journey toward faith." — **Rev. Chan Sun Hing**

"This program has been immensely beneficial to me. As a mother of three, I often feel overwhelmed by daily pressures. During my financial struggles, the 'Social Caring Volunteer Coupon Subsidy' not only offered practical support but also made me feel valued and cared for. I have had the opportunity to participate in various church activities, where I learned new skills and enjoyed more opportunities for social interaction, alleviating my sense of isolation. I no longer experience the same levels of anxiety or depression; I recognize my own worth. The beadwork class has ignited my creativity, and I am now able to design and sell my own jewelry. The church has truly made a significant impact on my life, and I hope to continue learning more craft skills. This is not only a passion but also a means to enhance my income. I also wish to connect with more people, share my experiences, and assist others who have faced similar challenges. If the church can continue to provide these resources, I believe it will benefit many more." — **Participant Ah Fong (alias)**

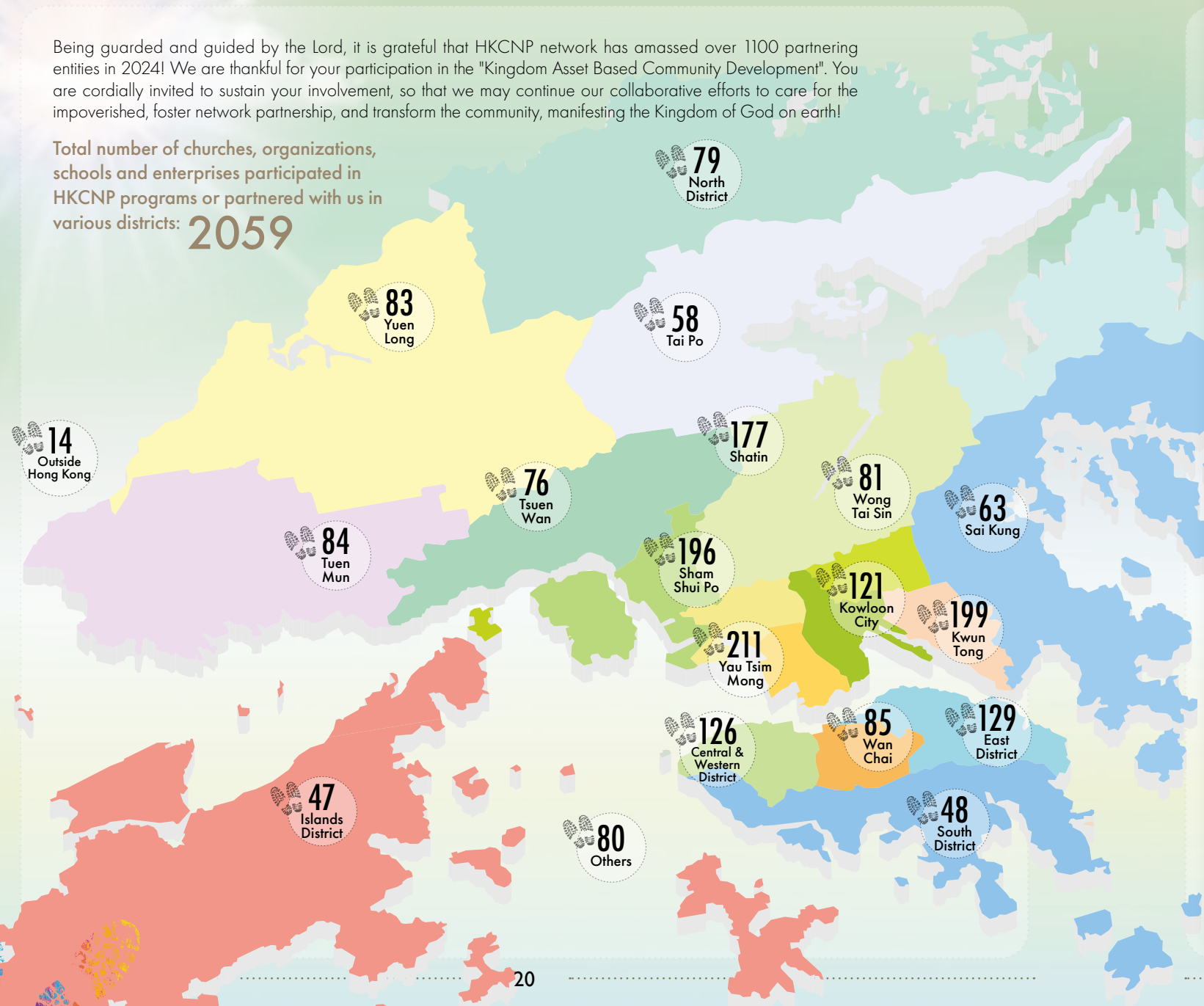

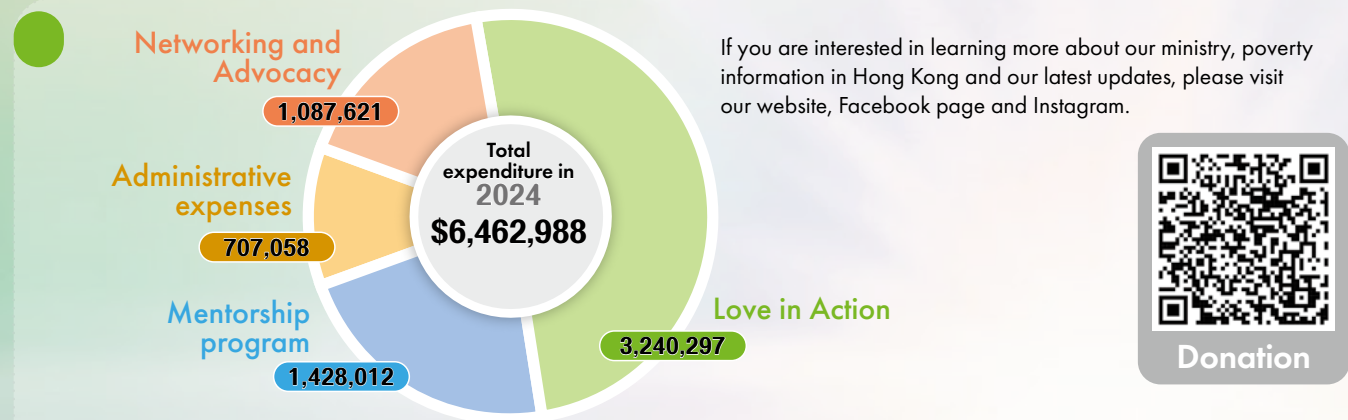
